'Smile always' supported child centered community development. We acknowledge that in order to improve the life and future of a child, the poverty of the family and the community, in which they live, must be addressed.

Our main focus is on education. Educating the child, and educating the family and community has become priority. Education is not just about reading and writing, but learning new ways of income generation and all round development of personality. For around a dollar a day, we can provide education for a child living in poverty and help his/her family and community to get involved in development activities.

Our experience over the last 7 years has shown us that, surroundings of child play a major role on his/her life. Therefore, 'Smile always' Child supported program has been designed to work for the welfare of both children and community. Thus the main focus is on school education to the relevant age children and to equip the families with learning skills to become self reliant



## Hostels (Orphan Children Support)

Year by year the Organization grew and established 5 Hostels in AP with a total strength of 100 children. The children are provided with food, shelter, clothing and education till they complete High School Education.

We extended this opportunity for 100 children during this Project Year 2011-2012. The children are in 5 Hostels situated in backward areas in Andhra Pradesh. Thereby accommodating needy children with all the facilities for their education, healthy living, recreational rooms, prayer hall, and good play ground. Such structures even attracted the local communities and also local leaders and Government Officials. Children were provided till they completed school education (1st class to 10th class).

# Youth Welfare Camps / Training



Most of the children excelled even in board examinations in distinctions and merits. Later the continuation of further education was difficult because it was college levels, very much expensive.

The only alternative was to go back to his/her village which would repeat the same underprivileged conditions from where she/he was picked up. Initially, our experience and studies reveal that the child was not being (after completion of 10th class) accommodated/acclimicised as he/she grew in rich congenial atmosphere provided in the hostels.

When seriously thought of it, prayerfully we came up with a conclusion to start Youth Welfare Camps/Trainings that is giving technical training in respective skills. Vocational skill training was given in typing, electrical works, motor driving, mechanism, screen printing ,computer training, basket making, sewing, tailoring and embroidery.

At the end of each course an government recognized certificate was given along with subsidize equipment. Fortunately year by year the program excelled, many were able to earn themselves, their own livelihood and secured jobs.

## Water Well and Community Development

Smile always provided about 12 wells from 2010 in drought hit districts of Prakasam, Guntur, Nalgonda, Kurnool and Ranga Reddy districts in Andhra Pradesh, India. This year we have digged 2 bore-well in Prakasam District.


As reported in India millions of deaths each year due to water borne diseases and it accounts for one third of the global deaths due to disease spread by contaminated food and water. Most of the victims are children under five years of age, and diarrhea, followed by hepatitis account for water borne diseases in the country. The reasons for such a high toll due to water borne diseases are lack of safe drinking water, and food hygiene conditions etc.,

The provision of Drinking water in this drought areas fulfilled the prime requirement of the people in these areas. "Water most Sacred symbol of life".

### Agriculture, Horticulture and Kitchen gardens:

As the farmers are suffering from huge loss and the money lenders are exploiting the situation by giving loans at high interest rates and the people are living in indebtedness. Undertaken awareness and demonstration programmes of new crop techniques to increase the crop yield. Educated the farmers in cultivating one dry crop and one wet crop. Selected remote villages where the farmers are still following the ancient methods in cultivation. Taught them the new improved methods in Agriculture, Horticulture and also Kitchen Gardens to increase the crop yield and also to cultivate cash crops.

Women have been given emphasis in the program, were motivated to cultivate kitchen garden, the produce of which was utilized for their family and the rest was sold in vegetable markets, thereby improving their economic conditions. The Field supervisors explain about usage of hybrid seeds and also usage of fertilizers and pesticides at the right time, much emphasis was given for mushroom cultivation as there is demand due to high protein content.



## Integrated Community Development

Integrated Community Development program (ICDP) to serve the backward communities where the family is benefited rather than an individual child. In this new approach the children receive opportunity to pursue their education while the parents are provided with an opportunity to develop new skills and participate in group activities and also inculcate habit of savings to develop them to reach sustainability both at personal and community level. 'Smile always' has established 5 Zonal Offices with a Zonal Officer along with other field staff to supervise and implement the program activities in the target areas. This is a family focus program.

Through this program over 3000 families will be benefited. These families are on the path of development to reach sustainability.

### *The activity components of ....*

1. Child Education and Opportunities
2. Group Formations and development,
3. Literacy and awareness
4. Health awareness
5. Savings groups and Income generation
6. Vocational skills training

- ❑ 200 identified children in the communities provided with educational opportunities viz., Books, School supplies, Uniform, coaching classes for those who are poor in studies.
- ❑ The Program activities are in 5 Zonal areas
- ❑ Target area consists of about 15 villages, targeting poor and marginalized communities
- ❑ Parents of the identified children and some others motivated to form into SHG Groups
- ❑ Building the capacity of the group members
- ❑ Creating opportunities for groups to learn new skills
- ❑ Health awareness and HIV/AIDS, T.B, Malaria (ATM)
- ❑ Inculcating habit of Savings, 28 groups with 560 members
- ❑ Encouraging savings based credit system
- ❑ Enabling to establish Income Generating activities.
